Annual Reunion Choral Evensong – 5th July 2008



When Andrew Lucas spoke to you at the inaugural evensong last year he mentioned that there was no Ex-Choristers' Association; this is no longer the case and we now appear to be developing a thriving organisation.

This year's Reunion Choral Evensong will take place in St. Albans Cathedral on Saturday, 5th July and will be followed by a reception if weather permits in the Dean's garden, where you will be able to catch up with former friends and colleagues. Details will be available in June.

Earlier in the afternoon there will be a very short general meeting to review the Association's activities and plans and this is an opportunity for members to ask questions and make suggestions to the committee.

The task of collating responses from our members is administratively time-consuming and attached to this newsletter is a reply form which you should return to the Chairman, either by post or electronically if you wish to participate in this year's reunion. It would be helpful if, when replying, you could provide as much of the requested information as possible.

50th Luccombe Choir Camp - Ex-Choristers' Weekend 25th to 27th July 2008

All members of the Ex-Choristers Association are invited to visit the 50th Choir Camp from the evening of Friday 25th July until after tea on the evening of Sunday 27th July and may take advantage of one of the following packages.

Option 1. The Campers' Package (Max 2 nights – own tents in nearby field)

Option 2. The Non-Campers' Package (Own accommodation arrangements in the local area)

We are delighted to announce that Mr. Simon Preston OBE, Hon FRCO, MA, Mus B has accepted Honorary Membership of the Ex-Choristers' Association. In addition to his notable achievements at Kings College Cambridge, Westminster Abbey, Christ Church Oxford and as an international organ recitalist, Simon spent a year at St. Albans in 1968 as Master of the Music whilst Peter Hurford was on a Sabbatical in the USA. Website eArchive

Did you know that there was a choir camp in the 1920s? There was, at Bow Brickhill near Milton Keynes where the boys camped in three railway carriages owned by Sydney Nicholson, Master of the Music at Westminster Abbey. One of our oldest members, Raymond Hughes who has just celebrated his 94th birthday participated. Camps were also held at Tenbury Wells in the late 40's/early 50's, supervised by the late Peter Burton.

During the last few weeks and months we have contacted and/or visited some of our more senior members including Jeffrey Collins, Harold Page, Alan Godfrey, Bob Fitzsimmons, John Tournay, Peter Ward and John Bate who sang in the choir in decades spanning the 30's to the 50's. We have also been in contact with younger 'veterans' like Ian Woods, Stephen Guy and Keith Hill and together they have been able to put some names to faces in the older choir photographs.

We are also cataloguing all the recordings and broadcasts made by the Cathedral Choir and the Abbey Girls' Choir, the earliest broadcast Choral Evensong currently identified being in 1963. Fellow members Rogers Covey-Crump and Tony Robson, together with Lance Andrews (LAMMAS Records), are contributing to this project.

Chris Sharp, John Adams, Simon Colston and Malcolm Bury, with support from Dr David Kelsall, the Cathedral Archivist, have now started to develop an electronic archive of the two choirs which, hopefully, will be launched on the website in June. Quite a few choir photos and documents relating to the choir's activities going back as far as the 1860s have been located and are being catalogued and preserved.
